Everything is Unexpected...

The April 2015 American Speech and Hearing (ASAH) Leader Journal reported on studies in cognitive science and neuroscience at MIT. Researchers used a computational model to investigate aspects of autism. The model grouped the various traits of autism as a difficulty in "predictive impairment."

Unpredictability is very strongly associated with anxiety and when individuals experience anxiety, they use strategies to cope such as self-stimulating behaviors (self-talk, hand flapping, etc.) When predictable routines change or unfamiliar figures replace familiar one, anxiety surfaces and tantrums can result. This can explain the insistence on things being the same, sensory hypersensitivities, the perspective-taking (theory of mind)

At Rock Brook School we find many of our students (autistic or not) have difficulties with unexpected events or changes. We try to prepare them for new experiences through verbal rehearsals, social stories, and video experiences. We also teach coping mechanism and strategies for when students are challenged by the unpredictable during the school day. And still there are times that no one can anticipate what will be a difficult moment and so we try to help them out, prompt some solutions, and wait as the student works things out. Speech Department News

May is Better Hearing and Speech Month!



BHSM brings communication disorders to the forefront and provides the perfect opportunity to raise awareness of these impairments. Development of communication skills, including speech, language, and hearing, is vital to child development. Now is the time to recommit to healthy communication habits! But what ARE "healthy communication habits?"

- Adequate **hearing** status is important for acquisition of speech sounds and language skills. Without being able to properly hear the words spoken around them, children can experience difficulty with the accuracy and precision of speech sound production. Comprehension and production of language depends on a person's ability to hear and interpret what they hear. Regular hearing screenings may help detect hearing difficulties early on!
- Effective speech production, such as articulation, fluency, and voice, is necessary for the production of intelligible speech. When speech is unclear, too rapid, or produced at an inappropriate volume, it can be difficult for listeners to understand and communication breakdowns may occur.
- Strong language skills are the key to effective communication. Individuals with poor hearing or speech skills are often mistaken for having poor language skills as well. A total communication approach, using signed speech, augmentative communication, and verbal skills, can help these individuals access rich language! As Rosemary Crossely said: Not being able to speak is not the same as not having anything to say!
