Program Updates by Principal- Katie Hardgrove



Every new school year brings an opportunity for change and reflection. I am excited for the many programming initiatives that will continue for this school year. These include: some students switching classes throughout the day for individualized academics and specials experience; technology-rich programming in the classrooms enhanced by technology classes; home living skills instruction through com-

munity trips, and focus on social skills development overseen by our school counselor that are integrated into interactions in the school community. Our certified behavioral analyst, Christen Russell, is here two days a week this year supporting students, taking data and coaching staff.

We are starting this school year off with 10 High School Students! This is our 3rd year of the program, and we have almost tripled the amount of students served since the first year. With that in mind, the High School class moved into what was classroom 7.

The Middle School Program has combined students from classroom 7, classroom 6 and a few students new to class 6. Leslye Manna, long term RBS teacher, joins Alyssa Kraus as a co-teacher for this school year. Leslye will be responsible for teaching students and supporting the Class 6 academic program in all subjects to continue to ensure the individual learning needs of the students are met.

In the 2013- 2014 school year, we were fortunate to have had a Pull-out Resource Support Teacher and we are excited to be able to offer it again for this school year. As an experienced teacher who has been at RBS for 16 years, Gail Morris brings her strong content knowledge and understanding of student's individual learning styles to this position. Gail will provide extra academic support to all students throughout the school, assist with transitioning new students including assessing them and helping them acclimate to RBS.

Technology

Also, as we continue our commitment to offering a technology-rich program, we have recently updated the Technology Plan for the next three years. Please check it out to see the goals and objectives. Along with increasing the variety of apps and technology experiences, we also continue to have some students who require the use of Augmentative and Alternative Communication (AAC) devices. One of our Speech-Language Specialists, Liz Varall, will be supporting the Speech Therapists with programming and maintenance needs of the devices. Liz and Maggie Deeds (Tech Coordinator) invite parents of AAC users to come in for individual **Parent Connection** meetings.

We are using a <u>new</u> computer program for our IEP's. The program is called IEP Direct which is part of Frontline Technologies. Most of our sending school districts use this program. This allows us to share the document with the district so that parents/guardians will receive one fluid copy of the IEP report. We will still be able to send home a draft copy prior to the scheduled meetings. More information will be sent home regarding this in the upcoming months.

New Parent Communication Model

This year we will be utilizing a Problem Solving Model by Margaret Searle.

The purpose of the Problem solving process is to improve the effectiveness of staff and parents meeting the needs of the students and to establish a safe and welcoming environment for everyone to work together solving problems.

STEPS:

- The teaching team or parent will call/ email to schedule a meeting
- Before the meeting, everyone will identify the "problem"/ concern and bring to the meeting ideas for action
- ◆ At the meeting, the focus will be on brainstorming interventions that can occur in school, home, and by the student (if applicable)



- After the meeting, everyone receives copies of minutes and interventions are started
- Follow-up meetings will be scheduled to revise interventions/ discuss updates

Parent Connection meetings will be offered again this year! As always, please feel free to request a meeting to discuss your child's technology needs.

Additionally, Ms. Maggie and Miss Liz will be inviting parents of AAC users for individualized chat times regarding your child's device usage.
