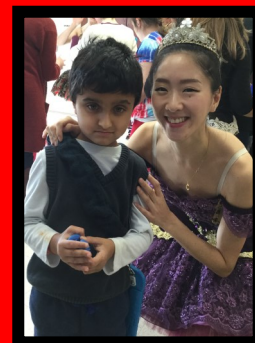

First Ombudsman for People with Developmental Disabilities

Paul Aronson is New Jersey's first Ombudsman for people with developmental disabilities. I had to look up the definition: "An Ombudsman is an official appointed to protect and/or investigate complaints about public institutions or authorities." Mr. Aronson is a long-time advocate for the developmental disability community and personally experienced the challenges of a family member who lived many years with a severe, degenerative disability. It is hoped that in his role he can help build connections between the state, care provider, families, individuals and other public agencies.

His specific tasks are to:


1. Serving as a source of information for people with developmental disabilities
2. Coordinating with NJCDD to provide information and support on obtaining state services
3. Proving help to individuals to resolve disagreements with state agencies
4. Work with service recipients, families, and the departments to facilitate the provision of services and supports
5. Identify common concerns and make recommendations to the state
6. Assist the Division of Children's System of Care and the Division of Developmental Disabilities to create public information programs.


