With the holiday break soon approaching, there will be time for family, fun and rest! This time is a great opportunity to reinforce social skills while with family and friends over the break. Some skills to think about are taking turns, listening, giving and receiving compliments, greeting others, and using appropriate personal space. There are countless others of course and SO many ways to apply and practice these skills. As parents, you model social behaviors 24/7, and teach and reinforce them more than you realize! See below for some ideas to try over the holiday break.

- Point out social skills while playing and interacting with your child (Prompt them to communicate whose turn it is next, practice waiting their turn, only touch their playing piece etc.). Remember to verbalize things that we take for granted as knowing - and have fun!
- When dining out, encourage your child to place their order independently or with some assistance, to make eye contact and look at the server, etc.
- Break down the steps of social events for your child beforehand so they know what to expect. For example, when going to the movies - First we will wait on line. Next, we will buy our ticket for the movie. Then we will walk together to find our seat, etc.
- Use social stories! These pictures and words that clearly demonstrate what to expect in a given situation. The visual nature of this is helpful. It also reduces anxiety about the unexpected since your child will know what to expect.
- There are countless other ways to encourage and practice social skills with your child over the holiday break.
