<u>Cold and Flu Season</u>: As we continue into the cold & flu season please be diligent to keep our school safe and stay home when feeling ill.

- ★ Reminder of our illness policy
 - Fever > 100.4F will be sent home & must be fever free WITHOUT medications for 24 hours before returning to school.
 - o Diarrhea, excessive sneezing/cold symptoms will also be excluded for at least 24 hours, must have improvement of symptoms WITHOUT medication.

A doctor's note with alternative diagnosis and clearance for school is the best way to keep our school safe and diagnose between a common cold, RSV, Flu, and COVID-19.

HS 1 recently finished a unit on ancient civilizations. Students investigated how communities and cultures have changed over time. They learned about the cultural impact of the wheel, paper, theater, aqueducts, and the calendar. In addition, they incorporated this social studies unit with a science unit learning about simple machines. The students learned about the wedge, wheel and axle, lever, pulley, inclined plane and screw. They put together flip books about simple machines. During a scavenger hunt, the students found examples of simple machines around school. They even built their own catapults! The students have been having a lot of fun during community trips to the ShopRite, Impact Fitness, the Montgomery Fire Station, and the Pingry School.

This month, HS2 warmly welcomed their new teacher, Ms. Margie! The class enjoyed functional math skills, as well as learning both money and time skills. In addition, they explored historical contributions honoring Black History Month, World News, Current Trends, and Entertainment Real time news. They engaged in fun 100 day activities (stacking 100 cups, connecting 100 paper clips, and tossing a bean bag 100 times). The class also kicked off our Kindness Challenge this week. In addition, HS2 students made snow using baking soda and shaving cream as a part of a science lesson. HS2 students have been demonstrating positive efforts as well as continuing to work toward their individual goals.


